#### **OPENING VERSICLES**

Isaiah 53:3-6

- P He was despised and rejected by men;
- **C** a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief;
- **P** and as one from whom men hide their faces
- **C** he was despised, and we esteemed him not.
- **P** Surely he has borne our griefs
- **C** and carried our sorrows;
- P yet we esteemed him stricken,
- **C** smitten by God, and afflicted.
- **P** But he was wounded for our transgressions;
- **C** he was crushed for our iniquities;
- **P** upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace,
- **C** and with his stripes we are healed.

## + THE FIRST WORD +


John 19:14-16a; Luke 23:32-34a

<sup>14</sup>Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover. It was about the sixth hour. [Pilate] said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" <sup>15</sup>They cried out, "Away with him, away with him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." <sup>16a</sup>So he delivered [Jesus] over to them to be crucified.

<sup>32</sup>Two others, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. <sup>33</sup>And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. <sup>34a</sup>And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

## + THE SECOND WORD +


Luke 23:35-43

<sup>35</sup>And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at [Jesus], saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!" <sup>36</sup>The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine <sup>37</sup>and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" <sup>38</sup>There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

<sup>39</sup>One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" <sup>40</sup>But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? <sup>41</sup>And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." <sup>42</sup>And he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." <sup>43</sup>And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

## + THE FOURTH WORD +


Matthew 27:45-47

John 19:28-29




John 19:30a


<sup>30</sup>When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, "It is finished."

Luke 23:45b-46; Matthew 27:54



#### THE STREPITUS

Strepitus is Latin for "noise". After the Paschal Candle is removed from the Sanctuary to symbolize the death of Christ, a loud noise is made (the Strepitus). This noise recalls the earthquake that occurred at Christ's death and the large stone being put into place to seal his tomb. The Paschal Candle is then returned to remind us that, even in death, Christ does not leave us. Once the Strepitus is concluded, the service concludes as follows:

- **P** O Lord, have mercy upon us.
  - O Christ, have mercy upon us.
  - O Lord, have mercy upon us.
- C Amen.

The congregation is asked to leave in silence, so that all may reflect on the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. No benediction or blessing will be spoken at the conclusion of this service. Good Friday is to be viewed as the second part of the larger three part service known as the Triduum service. The Triduum consists of: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. The benediction spoken at the conclusion of worship on Easter Sunday concludes the Triduum.
